



New Year's Wednesday 1st January 2025 Morning Adoration: 9am, followed by Holy Mass at 9:30. Both celebrations will take place at Christ the King church, Alfreton.

Parish Lunch, Monday 6th January 2025 at 1pm. The booking lists for the January Pensioners Lunch are now at the back of both churches.
